

## Completing the Aboriginal Studies Minor

This document contains information on how to complete the Aboriginal Studies Minor within three years. One possible course path is suggested on this side of the page. The back of the page lists all the courses that are currently eligible towards the Minor. You can also use this document to keep track of which courses you have taken or need to take.

### Completing the Minor in Three Years:

(1) In Year 1: fulfill the following 4 requirements (use the following suggested courses, or choose your own):

- ANTH 2414 (you must take this core course)
- One course from a discipline other than Anthropology (e.g., ENGL 2160) \_\_\_\_\_
- One course from a discipline different from the above two (e.g., S/A 2220) \_\_\_\_\_
- One course from a discipline different from the above three (e.g., H/A 3520) \_\_\_\_\_

(2) In Years 2 and 3: take 4 other courses. Some suggestions include:

- a. Courses that are offered once per year and that have no prerequisites: SWK 5522, SWK 5614
- b. Courses that are offered every other year, and that have no prerequisites: HIST 4222, LWSO 3012, LING 2060.
- c. Courses that are offered every year, and that have prerequisites: ANTH 3510, ANTH 3290, EDUC 4020, EDUC 2023, S/A 4070.
