Considering graduate study in geography? The Department of Geography at Memorial University in St. John's, Newfoundland, is offering competitive, **fully funded** studentships for **MA, MSc., and PhD** programs, starting in Fall 2012. The Geography graduate program attracts students from across Canada and around the world, and provides opportunities for field-based scientific and social scientific studies in a wide variety of areas. Key topics and areas of expertise for faculty at Memorial include:

- Coastal zone management and environmental governance
- Arctic climate and environmental systems
- Environmental history of fisheries and aquaculture
- Rural and regional development
- Geographies of electronic waste production and disposal
- Recreation, resources and environmental values
- Climate variability and change in the Canadian North
- Historical geography of mining and resource development
- Biosecurity, disease and agricultural systems
- Geomatics and marine habitat mapping
- Geographies of development and indigenous peoples
- Deep-sea coral habitat

Students attending Memorial receive instruction in geographical practices and methods appropriate to their field of study, leading to field research opportunities and the preparation of a master's thesis. Our program offers the chance to interact with a diverse array of fellow students and to live and study in St. John's, the culturally vibrant capital of the ruggedly beautiful province of Newfoundland. Our graduates go on to further advanced study, university faculty positions, and government and private sector employment.
