STRATEGIC SESSION

ARC-NL is a pilot research centre within Memorial University to March 31, 2023. Prior to the end of the timeframe for the pilot, ARC-NL must submit a proposal to Memorial University to achieve permanent status that is renewable every five years.

The Core Leadership Team (CLT) held a strategic session on October 21, 2021, to set direction as ARC-NL starts to development its proposal in late 2022/early 2023. The purpose was to reflect on the question:

What are we applying to become?

The session provided the opportunity to identify progress, accomplishments and challenges. Among some of the key points: adjust the criteria for research funding to ensure more community-based aging research, create research pillars or themes based on areas of expertise of Memorial researchers, simplify the governance structure, and broaden awareness of ARC-NL.

As ARC-NL prepares its proposal, those issues will be taken into consideration as we talk to our stakeholders and determine the future of ARC-NL.

OUR GOALS

As a pilot research centre, ARC-NL's priority is to achieve status as a permanent research centre within Memorial University. To that end, between now and March 31, 2023, ARC-NL will be guided in its work by the following goals:

- o Secure long-term funding
- Increase aging-related research and education at Memorial University
- Increase knowledge mobilization, communication, and engagement

MEET A RESEARCH MEMBER



Dr. Susan Mercer Faculty of Medicine Geriatric Medicine, Eastern Health

Dr. Mercer is a Care of the Elderly trained Family Physician in Geriatric Medicine at Eastern Health. Dr. Mercer sees patients who have declining health and function and makes recommendations about interventions to help improve their quality of life and function.

Dr. Mercer is now researching *An Inter-professional Model of Care for Frail Older Adults in Newfoundland and Labrador* through an ARC-NL grant. This project takes on three different aspects:1) a literature review to look at models of care for frailty that exist across the country and around the world; 2) an environmental scan of the aspects of frailty care that currently exist for outpatients in the Eastern Health region; and 3) the compilation of local and national expert opinions on the gaps, strengths, and challenges of developing this model. The end goal is to work on a larger grant proposal to fund a project for the implementation of the frailty model

2022 CALL FOR RESEARCH GRANTS

ARC -NL announced its call for research grants and adjusted its approach from previous years to encourage more research in social sciences/population-based research to align priorities with our major funder -the Department of Children, Seniors and Social Development (CSSD). For the 2022-23 Research Grants, ARC-will fund two research grants of up to \$25,000 each as follows:

- The top overall proposal from any discipline that meets the criteria
- The top proposal in the area of social sciences/populationbased research
