Alicia araduated with her Bachelor of Science Honours degree in Biology in the Spring of 2021. Her thesis focused on gene expression in fruit fly models associated with aging and neurodegenerative disease, completed under the supervision of ARC-NL member Dr. Brian Staveley. She will begin her masters of science in September where her research will investigate environmental and genetic factors of hearing loss and neurodeaenerative disease co-supervised by Dr. Ben Zendel and Dr. Terry-Lynn Young. A resident of Mount Pearl, Alicia recently worked as a research assistant with ARC-NL on an age-friendly communities project. That work has allowed her to explore the sociological and political aspect of the aging process, where her previous research experience had focused on the cell and molecular level.
