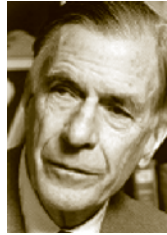

This annual lecture is made possible through a generous donation from the late Dr. John Kenneth Galbraith. It brings to Memorial University outstanding figures whose work reflects their commitment to excellence in scholarship and public affairs. This lecture is an initiative of Memorial University's Leslie Harris Centre and the Offices of the President and the Dean of Arts.



Past Galbraith speakers have included: Dr. Lloyd Axworthy, former federal cabinet minister and then-director of the Liu Centre for the Study of Global Issues at UBC; Mr. Geir Haarde, the Prime Minister of Iceland; Hon. Roy J. Romanow, Q.C., former Saskatchewan premier and commissioner of the federal Commission on the Future of Health Care in Canada; political analyst and journalist Jeffrey Simpson, OC; Dr. Kenneth Carty, an expert on political parties and electoral reform, from the University of British Columbia; and Dr. Margaret MacMillan, author of *Paris 1919: Six Months that Changed the World*, and *Nixon in China: The Week that Changed the World*.

## DR. THEODORE DALRYMPLE

“Dr. Theodore Dalrymple” is the pen name of Dr. Anthony Daniels, a philosopher, physician, psychiatrist, world traveler, sociologist, journalist and critic based in the United Kingdom.



He is commonly referred to as the George Orwell of our time, as his writing produces a body of thought that is deeply suspicious of contemporary intellectual fashions.

He has written 16 books on an extensive amount of topics including culture, arts, politics, education, medicine and travel. He has also written for a number of journals and his essays for the *City Journal* of New York have been collected in three volumes, one of which is *Life at the Bottom: The Worldview that Makes the Underclass* (2001). Other published works include: *In Praise of Prejudice* (2007) and *Not with a Bang But a Whimper* (2008).

He is Dietrich Weismann fellow of the Manhattan Institute of New York.
