Carolyn gave a presentation on the highlights of the program development which

There is a new accident/incident reporting system whereby students can text to an email	
address. Mike was concerned that the current practice of lab instructors completing	
incident forms would be negatively impacted. Current practice will continue. The use	
of texting as a reporting tool is intended to capture incidents not currently reported. Dr.	
McKay was wondering on response time. Carolyn was satisfied with the time when she	
tested it.

is new construction to allow commissioning. Chemistry Building will be next.
