Tri-agency harmonization of the Canada Graduate Scholarships program

The federal granting agencies will be introducing a new model for the CGS-Masters awards this fall, based on consultations over the past six months. More detailed communications will be shared with institutions in the coming weeks, but the essence of the change is to shift to a single-stage process, in which institutions will receive a quota of awards based on an incoming model (i.e., for students proposing to undertake Master's degree

This workshop will give an overview of the new CCV and the various agencies which use it, followed by a hands-on session where you can practice entering your data using the available desktop computers.
