Teaching Appointments

The School of Nursing offers several programs: (1) a collaborative baccalaureate program offered in conjunction with the two other Nursing Schools in the Province; (2) a BN (Post-RN) baccalaureate program delivered by distance; and (3) a Master's program with both thesis and non-thesis routes offered through distance delivery. The School of Nursing plays a leadership role in nursing research conducted in this province and is actively engaged in international projects.

Applications are invited from qualified individuals for short term teaching appointments at the level of Lecturer for the academic year 2012/2013. All applicants should have a minimum of a Master's degree in Nursing, preferably. Recent expertise in any of the clinical areas of practice is an asset.

Positions are available to teach lecture courses, on campus, in the BN (Collaborative) program (e.g., anatomy/physiology, pathophysiology, women's health, health promotion, nursing of children) and clinical courses in the area of maternal/child nursing, nursing of children, nursing of adults and older adults, mental health nursing, occupational health, and community health nursing. Positions are also available to teach courses in the distance BN (Post-RN) program.

All positions are subject to budgetary approval and sufficient enrollments.
