

Services by ORS and OCP




- Institutional signature for applications, contracts and agreements
 - ✤ ~\$110 million in research grants and contracts representing ~1,500 research projects
- Grant applications: comprehensive and institutional reviews, submission
- Contracts: Review and negotiate terms of research contracts and agreements
- Authorization to FAS to establish research accounts; tracking clearances (Animal Care, Ethics, etc.) limited term
- Administration of Internally funded grant programs (ORS)
- Liaison with Tri-Council (CIHR, NSERC, SSHRC) and other research funding organizations and agencies; accountability and regulatory requirements (ORS)
- Workshops and faculty/staff orientations
- Capturing and reporting of information on Memorial's research effort
- Developing new research/strategic initiatives in consultation with the Office of the Vice-President Research and academic units
- Information services, eg: ORS Web Site; Funding opportunities/deadlines; Agency guidelines





CIHR



- CIHR's mission is to create new scientific knowledge and to enable its translation into improved health, more effective health services and products, and a strengthened Canadian health care system.
- Many CIHR programs lend themselves to 'Engagement'
- Nominated Principle Applicants can include independent researchers and knowledge users affiliated with eligible institutions
 - Knowledge user: a practitioner, policy maker, educator, decision maker, health care administrator, community leader, or an individual in a health charity, patient group, private sector organization or a media outlet

CIHR – Knowledge Translation Grants



Select Funding tools	Goal
Planning Grant	Support planning activities and partnership development
Collaborative Health Research Projects	Support focused collaborative research projects involving health science and either natural sciences or engineering (<i>Bridging CIHR and NSERC</i>)
Knowledge Synthesis Grant	Support teams of researchers and knowledge users Promote decision-making and practice based on synthesized evidence
Knowledge to Action Grant	Move knowledge into action by linking researchers to knowledge users Support implementation projects
Proof of Principle (Phase I and II)	Advance discoveries or inventions towards commercialization

CIHR - Partnership



- Partnership for Health System Improvement (PHSI)
 - partnership may involve community, government or industry partners
 - support teams of researchers and decision makers interested in conducting applied health services and policy research that will be useful to health system managers and/or decision makers
 - teams are required to bring in a minimum of 20% of the amount requested from CIHR from external partners (i.e., non-CIHR partners).

NSERC



- NSERC promotes and supports discovery research, and fosters innovation by encouraging Canadian companies to participate and invest in postsecondary research projects
- Many NSERC programs are designed for 'Engagement'
- Partnerships Programs Overview
 - Research Partnerships Programs foster collaborations between university researchers, colleges and other sectors (including government and industry) in order to develop new knowledge and expertise, and transfer it to Canadian-based organizations.

NSERC – Partnership Programs



- <u>Strategic Partnerships Program</u> to accelerate research in areas of national importance to Canada and where the country can be a world leader.
- Industry-Driven Collaborative Research and Development <u>Program</u> – to address industry's research and training needs and priorities, facilitate the productive use of knowledge through partnership projects, and build a critical mass of expertise through *Industrial Research Chairs* (IRC).
- <u>Commercialization Program</u> to increase market connection, knowledge translation and technology transfer by providing resources and expertise to fill the gap between the completion of the research and the uptake by end users.
- <u>Training in Industry Program</u> to connect companies with skills and increase the experiential training of students in industry.

NSERC – Select Partnership Grants



- Interaction Grants support researchers from Canadian universities to meet with Canadian-based companies with the objective of identifying a company-specific problem
- <u>Engage Grants</u> short-term research and development projects aimed at addressing a company-specific problem
- <u>Collaborative Research and Development (CRD)</u> support welldefined projects undertaken by university researchers and their private-sector partners. CRD awards cover up to half of the total eligible direct project costs, with the industrial partner(s) providing the balance in cash and in kind.
- <u>Idea to Innovation (I2I)</u> provide funding to university researchers for research and development activities leading to technology transfer to a new or established Canadian company

SSHRC



- Promotes and supports postsecondary-based research and training in the humanities and social sciences
- Many SSHRC programs lend themselves to 'Engagement'
- Support partnership with Business Partners, Community Partners and through Joint Initiatives (pools resources for research and related activities with other agencies, government departments and collaborators across the public, private and not-for-profit sectors)

SSHRC Partnership strategy

bring together the specialized capabilities and resources of researchers, community organizations, the private sector and governments, to create and mobilize knowledge in the social sciences and humanities

SSHRC - Programs



Insight Program

- build knowledge and understanding about people, societies and the world by supporting research excellence in all subject areas eligible for funding from SSHRC.
- support new approaches to research on complex and important topics, including those that transcend the capacity of any one scholar, institution or discipline

Connection Program

realize the potential of social sciences and humanities research for intellectual, cultural, social and economic influence, benefit and impact on and beyond the campus by supporting specific activities and tools that facilitate the flow and exchange of research knowledge.

SSHRC – Select Grants



Partnership Development Grants

develop research and related activities in the social sciences and humanities; support over one to three years to teams/partnerships

Partnership Grants

support new and existing formal research and/or knowledge mobilization partnerships over four to seven years

Connection Grants

To support short-term (1 year), targeted knowledge mobilization events and activities

AIF Funding



- Supports R&D directly linked to the development and commercialization of technology-based products, processes or services.
- Up to \$3 million available / 80% of total eligible costs available
- Demonstrate adequate financing for duration of the project
- Private sector participation important!!!

AIF Investments in Innovation



- Total AIF investments in NL 68 projects / \$196 million since inception representing \$451 million in Project Value
- Currently, MUN engaged in 16 AIF projects
 - 13 projects MUN proponent
 - ✤ 3 projects research participants
 - Current AIF contributions \$35 million / \$60 million in project value
 - 160 + management, technical, research and administrative personnel employed

AIF Objectives



- Increase R&D being carried out in Atlantic Canada research facilities
- Improve the regions capacity to commercialize R&D
- Strengthen the regions innovation system by supporting commercialization partnerships between the private sector and universities and institutions in Atlantic Canada

Terms of Engagement



- Mutual recognition of each party's expectations
 - Value Proposition Leverage knowledge for competitive advantage
 - Right to commercialize IP
 - Student education & training, right to publish and build capacity
 - Generate royalties from IP

- MRP responsible for the pre-Award and post-Award administration of AIF applications
 - Stage 1 Letter of Intent May / June
 - Stage II Full Proposal September / October
 - Competition Dates to be confirmed in April

Snapshot of Funding



- Memorial University currently has 18 active Canada Research Chairs.
- Since its inception, CFI has awarded Memorial approximately \$52M to 130 projects (i.e., CFI awards are a maximum of 40% of the total project cost).
- Since its inception, RDC has awarded Memorial approximately \$50M to 170 projects.
- Currently, OCP oversees 4 projects totaling \$1.5M.

- The Office of the Vice President (Research) recently issued a Call for Expressions of Interest for CFI's Leaders Opportunity Fund (LOF) - due February 25, 2013.
- RDC will accept applications at any time, but targeted calls can be issued. Partner funding is required to avail of the majority of RDC's funding programs.
- PRNL will accept applications at any time, but targeted calls can be issued. Partner funding may / may not be required.
