The Rev'd Canon Eric Beresford

Eric Beresford is President of Atlantic School of Theology (since December 2004). Previously he was Consultant for Ethics and Interfaith Relations for the Anglican Church of Canada in based in Toronto. In that capacity he was seconded to the work of the Anglican Communion Office based in London, England working with the Anglican Consultative Council and the Primates of the Anglican Communion.

As an ethicist, Canon Beresford has developed a deep and abiding interest and experience in the area of environmental ethics and medical ethics. For seven years he was an Assistant Professor at McGill University (Montreal, Canada) in the faculty of Religious Studies and taught in the McGill Centre for Medicine Ethics and Law and in the Environmental Studies program. He is the founder of the Anglican Communion Environmental Network and member of the Climate Change Action Network. He was also co-chair of the Ecumenical Justice Committee of Kairos (a social justice coalition based in Toronto, Canada).

Canon Beresford is a scholar and writer who is widely published in professional journals and sought after as a consultant and speaker at workshops and conferences in the fields of ethics, environmental justice, conflict and change, and human sexuality.

He is an ordained Anglican Priest who has served parishes in England and Canada and continues to serve on national committees of the Anglican Church of Canada.
