Master's students must choose an eligible payment plan when accepting an offer of admission. Please note that normally the payment plan can only be changed in the student's first semester. Plan C is available to full-time students in certain programs only listed below.

Students must pay the full program fee. If any program is completed in fewer semesters than the number of semesters listed above, a payment of an amount equal to the remaining number of semesters is required (e.g., if 9 semesters are to be paid and the program is completed in 7, the 2 remaining semester fees must be paid).

**Continuance Fees:** Students who do not complete their programs in the number of semesters listed above will be required to pay a continuance fee for each additional semester required as listed below.

### Distance Courses and Special Delivery Fees

The cost of program courses is included in the program fee. However, there is a charge for distance courses and certain special delivery courses for certain student cohorts. Consult the academic unit of interest to see if a fee is charged.

### Recreation Fee (The Works)

All students are required to pay a recreation fee of \$53.04 each semester \$159.12 per year

### Dental Coverage (All full-time students)

The rate payable in each of the Fall, Winter and Spring semesters is \$65.56 \$196.68 per year

### Drug and Health Insurance (All full-time students)

The rate payable in each of the Fall, Winter and Spring semesters is \$184.65 \$553.95 per year  
(Students who already have coverage must complete an Opt Out form by the deadline - [www.gsumun.ca](http://www.gsumun.ca).)

### International Health Insurance and Medical Care Plan (MCP) (international students)

### Books and Stationery Supplies

The cost of books averages \$100 per course; the number of courses required varies from program to program. In addition, students will have further miscellaneous expenses in relation to course work and research. Students in programs requiring a thesis are required to pay \$20 for the cost of thesis binding at the time of submission for examination.

### Meals

Cooking facilities are provided with on-campus accommodation \$2,800 to \$4,500 per year

### Settling Allowance (all students; approximate)

For example, cutlery, linen, winter clothing for students from warmer climates \$600 to \$1,200
