Summary of the Research

The research proposed here is for a project entitled: "Premiers and Development Policies in Newfoundland and Labrador, 1949 to 2009."

The research is intended to lead to the writing of a book and/or articles about the nine men who served as Premier of Newfoundland and Labrador from Confederation with Canada in 1949 until 2010, with a particular emphasis on the five who, it will be argued, have had the most impact on development: Joey Smallwood, Brian Peckford, Clyde Wells, Brian Tobin and Danny Williams. The focus is mainly on a comparative description and analysis of each premier's approach to economic and social development for the province.

The research and analysis will be based on three main sources:

- 1. Secondary materials, including books, articles and newspaper accounts of each premier's activities and pronouncements.
- 2. Drawing on the researcher's own experience and records accumulated while working in a senior public service position for three of the premiers (Peckford, Wells and Williams—as well as an earlier interview with Smallwood about his approach to development).
- 3. Interviews with former and current premiers, cabinet ministers and senior public servants, as well as leaders in other spheres over the years (business, labour, academia and the community sector).
