Jo Shawyer is a retired academic who specializes in geography, particularly cultural landscapes. She has studied urban and rural cultural landscapes in England and Canada, focusing on planning, policy and historical significance. Jo has been involved with community museums for many years, including the Fanshawe Pioneer Museum in London, Ontario and as a volunteer with the Museum Association of Newfoundland and Labrador. She has also curated exhibits and taught museum skills. Jo was a founding member of the Agricultural History Society of Newfoundland and Labrador and is a current member of the Museum Association of NL, the Association of NL Archives, the Newfoundland Historical Trust, the Newfoundland Historical Society, the Canadian Museum Association and Heritage

Canada. Although retired, Jo continues to research cultural landscapes and has published historical novels for young adults.


There are two groups which meet as follows:




