

## New Online Course ARCH 2494 Game of Genders: Sex & Society in the Medieval North

This course will consider how gender is represented in texts & objects from the Late Iron Age/early medieval material period (Anglo-Saxon and Viking-Age periods), and consider how gender is interpreted in scholarly and popular interpretations. We will look at examples of expressions of the whole gender spectrum in the medieval north. We will talk about what, where, and when was the medieval north, and whether individual gender expression can truly be seen in the archaeological or historical record of the period.
