### Overview

The University reserves the right to make changes to the regulations, fees and charges. It is the student's responsibility to be aware of these fees and charges (see [Financial and Administrative Services](#)) and the applicable deadlines (see [University Diary](#)). **Memorial University has three semesters per academic year commencing with Fall (September-December), then Winter (January-April), and finally Spring (May-August).**

**IMPORTANT:** Students must pay the full program fee. If you complete a program in an accelerated format (i.e. in fewer semesters than the number of semesters listed above), a lump sum payment of the remaining tuition is required. This is equal to the remaining number of semesters had you taken the program in the normal amount of semesters. For example, if you are on Masters' Payment Plan A (six semesters) and completed your program in five semesters, you'll need to pay the semester fee for one more semester as well before your degree/diploma can be conferred.

#### Information on Master's Payment Plans

Master's students must choose an eligible payment plan when accepting an offer of admission. Please note that normally, you can only change your payment plan in your first semester. Master's Payment Plan C is available to full-time students in certain programs only, as listed below.

- Master of Science in Mathematics – non-thesis route
- Master of Science in Applied Geomatics
- Master of Science in Medicine (Applied Health Services Research) – non-thesis route

## Ancillary Fees

### Distance Education [Administrative Fee](#)

The cost of program courses is included in the program fee. However, there is a charge for distance courses and certain special delivery courses for certain student cohorts. Please ensure your [current and Online Learning addresses](#) are up to date, and consult the academic unit of interest to see if a fee is charged.

### Campus Renewal Fee

All graduate students must pay a campus renewal fee of \$167 per semester, except for those on continuance. <i>(Note: the Campus Renewal Fee is paused for the academic year commencing September 2025 to August 2026.)</i>	\$501.00 per year

### Dental Coverage Fee (all full-time graduate students)

The rate payable is \$123.00 per semester. Students with alternate coverage must proactively <a href="#">opt out</a> .	\$369.00 per year

### Drug and Health Insurance Fee (all full-time graduate students)

The rate payable is \$188.33 per semester. Students with alternate coverage must proactively <a href="#">opt out</a> .	\$565.00 per year

### Foreign Health Insurance Plan (FHIP) – international students

International students are advised to contact the [Internationalization Office](#) for current rates for the [Guard.me foreign health insurance plan \(FHIP\)](#). If you have a study permit valid for 12 months or longer, you must [apply for the Newfoundland and Labrador Medical Care Plan \(MCP\)](#). Once you have MCP coverage, you can [opt out of the FHIP](#) and into the regular dental and health insurance as outlined above. This generally costs less.

### Books and Stationery Supplies

The cost of books averages \$100 per course; the number of courses required varies from program to program. In addition, students may have further miscellaneous expenses in relation to coursework and research.
