

Dr. Isabelle Dostaler has been named the new dean of the Faculty of Business Administration at Memorial, effective Sept. 1, 2017.



Before joining Memorial, Dr. Dostaler was a faculty member at the John Molson School of Business at Concordia University where she held positions as academic director of the Aviation Think Tank, accreditation director, and director of the Executive MBA and the Aviation MBA. Dr. Dostaler received her PhD from Cambridge University and holds bachelor's and master's degrees from HEC Montréal.

Dr. Isabelle Dostaler's research focuses on aerospace and aviation management, business strategy and performance and the impact of transportation on regional development. She's also interested in the field of management education and her recent research has focused on teaching methods and the gap between business practice and business research. Her research has been published in journals such as the Canadian Journal of Higher Education, Production and Operations Management, Journal of Air Transport Management, Journal of Aviation/Aerospace Education and Research, Operations Management Research and the Canadian Journal of Administrative Sciences. She also writes for a practitioner audience and is frequently asked by various media to comment on business news.
