
The data found in this section of the Fact Book have been compiled by the Office of the Registrar from their computerized files. The following definitions (as found in the University Calendar, www.mun.ca/regoff/calendar) and explanations should be noted:

Definitions:

- 1. Undergraduate students are categorized as follows:
 - * first-year students have earned fewer than 18 credit hours;
 - * second-year students have earned from 18 to 47 credit hours inclusive;
 - * third-year students have earned from 48 to 77 credit hours inclusive;
 - * fourth-year students have earned from 78 to 107 credit hours inclusive; and
 - * fifth-year students are those who have earned not fewer than 108 credit hours.
- 2. Full-time undergraduate students: students who have been admitted to this University and who are registered in at least nine credit hours for the duration of any semester or at least five credit hours in a session are deemed full-time students (reference University *Calendar* 2016-2017). (For full-time undergraduate student classification as it pertains to the programs at the Marine Institute, work-term students and members of University committees, see University *Calendar* 2016-2017, section 6.1.) Part-time undergraduate students: students who have been admitted to this University and who are registered for fewer then nine credit hours in any semester or fewer than five credit hours in any session (reference University *Calendar* 2016-2017).
- 3. A graduate student is one who has been admitted to a graduate degree or a graduate diploma program. A full-time graduate student is one who registers as such, devotes full time to his or her academic program and may not commit more than 24 hours a week working time, including teaching assistant or research assistant duties, to matters other than the degree program (reference University *Calendar* 2016-2017). A part-time graduate student is one who is registered for the duration of a semester and is not classified as full-time (reference University *Calendar* 2016-2017).
- 4. Full-time equivalent (FTE) enrolment is computed as full-time enrolment + (part-time enrolment/3.5).

Explanations:

- 1. Only enrolment data from the **Fall Semester** are shown in this Fact Book.
- 2. Enrolment data, for all tables, are compiled as of the end of the regular registration period which is two weeks after the start of classes. Data for Tables 3, 4, 4A and 8 are generated after Fall convocation.
- 3. Beginning in 2003-2004, Table 1 and Table 2 full-time and part-time undergraduate enrolment includes level '04' Diploma in Information Technology students. Level '04' enrolment is now included in the following Tables of the Student Profile: Table 5, 7A, 9, 11, 12 and 13.
- 4. Data recorded are as indicated on students' application for admission/readmission and other appropriate forms.
- 5. The 'unspecified' category in student enrolment includes 'not applicable', 'not specified', 'undeclared', and 'other'.
- 6. Tables 16, 17 and 18 refer to students attending the Marine Institute.
- 7. After 2004, the methodology for Tables 12, 13, 14 and 15 data are based on enrolled students' citizenship and permanent residence at the time of application.







Figures for general building services such as heat and light, and snow clearing, which is provided by the provincial Department of Works, Services and Transportation, are not included.

- Note 4: Expenditures for Technical Services are netted against internal recoveries.



Research Profile

Research Profile

- 1. The data used in these tables have been compiled **Nonether** records of the Office of Research, which provides an annual *Inventory of Sponsored Projects* of funded research projects after circulating preliminary lists to faculties and departments for crosschecking. The Office of Research figures are derived from notices of awards sent to successful applications. In some cases, researchers receive more or less money in a given year than is originally pledged and recorded.
- 2. The Office of Research also tracks non-financial external support for University research such items include free supplies involved in experiments, access to off-campus equipment, computer or other facilities and ship-time for researchers at sea.
- 3. Included in the 'Other' category are grants and/or awards for:

* Conferences/workshops/symposia

* Fellowships

* Infrastructure

* Scholarships

* Studentships

* Research personnel awards

* Equipment

* General support awards

* In-kind

* Ship-time

* Research chairs

* Travel

- 4. As of 2015/16 the category of "Other Grants" which included: chairs, conferences/workshops/symposia, general support grants, infrastructure, research personnel awards, travel, equipment and in-kind support, is no longer a seperate category. These amounts are now inluded in the appropriate line item under Operating Grants.
- 5. In addition to the standard operating grant, the category of Operating Grants includes the following:



- 6. In-kind is not regarded as a funding category. Instead, it is recorded as a type of funding like cash. All in-kind counts have already been included in the various funding categories. For example, if a sponsor provides an in-kind contribution as an operating grant, one operating grant is counted. In 2014-15, there were 40 in-kind awards.
- 7. Revenue earned by the Marine Institute for applied research and development activities is included in this report; however, revenue from industrial response training or other education and training programs is not included.
- 8. Operating grants are awarded to individuals or teams to cover part or all of the direct costs of particular research projects. They often include provisions for salaries paid to graduate students and other assistants, the University's share of fringe benefits costs, and the expense of materials, technical services, field travel and computing.
- 9. Operating Contracts are similar to operating grants but involve a contractual agreement that is more formal than the terms of a conventional grant. By means of contract, the sponsor normally acquires an interest in the results of the research and can enforce strict time, scope and reporting requirements. University policy, however, stipulates that investigators retain the right to publish, subject to a reasonable deferral period.
- 10. There is a difference in award counts in Tables 23 and 25. Table 23 counts actual awards whereas Table 25 counts the contributions from the various sponsor categories. For example, an award provided by two sponsors would be counted as one award in Table 23, but as two contributions in Table 25. In addition, beginning in 2011-12, a new database system in the Office of Research Services enables proportionate credit of funding between academic units engaged in interdisciplinary research. For example, an award from one sponsor could be recorded half in one unit and half in another unit. This will result in a count of two awards in Table 23 but only one award in Table 25. As a result of these practices, the net difference between Table 23 and Table 25, for 2014-15, is 13.








ONLINE LEARNING CENTRE FOR INNOVATION IN TEACHING AND LEARNING (CITL)

Committed to serving the university community online and on campus, CITL is Memorial's lead in delivery of online courses and programs, the provision of opportunities for educator development, and the integration and support for the effective use of technologies in teaching to engage learners and enhance the learning experience. Specifically, CITL's core functions include:

- Developing, delivering and supporting Memorial's online offerings, which include nearly 500 undergraduate and graduate courses, and 32 fully online and mixed mode programs.
- Providing support services for educators and learners (on campus and online) who use D2L or any educational technologies administered by the department, including administering exams for online offerings.
- Integrating educational technologies into on-campus courses and classrooms, and supporting instructors with appropriate technology training.
- Providing development opportunities to educators and graduate students to improve teaching practice.

Technologies designed and adopted for online delivery have been widely integrated into on-campus offerings. In the 15/'16 academic year 2,966 on-campus course sections used technology to enhance course delivery.






