**Candidate Profile and Job Description:** We seek a scholar with a completed or near-completed PhD (or equivalent) in Classics or in a related field and demonstrable excellence in teaching and research. The applicant will have a track record or show promise of high-quality scholarly research leading to peer-reviewed publications. Classical reception should form a substantial focus of the candidate's research profile. Teaching responsibilities may include topical courses in Greek and Roman Studies and ancient Greek and Latin language courses at all levels, from introductory to graduate. The candidate will also be invited to develop and teach dedicated courses and graduate seminars on classical reception.
