Hello, my name is Ann Blackmore. I am a Commercial Advisor at Chevron Canada, as well as an Instructor of Economics at Memorial University of Newfoundland. I have taught economics at MUN for over 10 years, primarily focusing on introducing students to all that economics has to offer. I personally attended MUN from 1996 - 2003, achieving a Bachelor of Commerce (Co-op) Honours and a Bachelor of Arts (Economics) and then following up with a Masters in Economics. I was originally enrolled in just the Business Faculty but after taking a few Economics courses and really enjoying them. I decided to do the two undergraduate degrees simultaneously. I have had a very fulfilling career thus far, and one of the most enjoyable parts has been helping shape the minds of Newfoundland's future generation.
