Rules and Details

Economics Research Presentation Competition - Winter 2024

Proposal Specifications

Submission should consist of a 1-page proposal, excluding cover page and references. Font should be 12-point Times New Roman, single spaced. No research paper submission required.

Cover page should include the title of the project, student name, year of studies, department, and MUN email address.

The proposal must include the following sections:

- 1. Introduction: Briefly introduce your research topic and state the research problem.
- 2. Literature review: Highlight past research on the selected topic.
- 3. Methodology: Outline your research design and methods, including data collection and analysis.
- 4. Conclusion: Summarize the key points of your research.

The proposal can be based on research projects for your current or past courses, or can be something completely new.

Sample topics might include the impact of rising interest rates on Canadian mortgage defaults, the effectiveness of monetary policy, the economic impact of COVID-19, etc. There are no restrictions on topics, except that the topic should be related to economics. Be creative!

Please note that you will own all copyrights to your work, and presenting at this competition will not impede your ability to reproduce this work for other purposes (academic, competitions, or otherwise)

Presentation Details

Each student will be given 7-10 minutes for their presentation and a 5 minute Q&A.

Competition judges will be industry professionals and volunteer faculty members (TBA).
