One Changing Ocean: A Northern Perspective

Eddy Carmack is a senior research scientist and climate oceanographer for Fisheries and Oceans Canada at the Institute of Ocean Sciences in Sidney, British Columbia. As a long-time observer of water, he has participated in more than 80 field investigations in rivers, lakes and seas spanning from the Antarctic to the Arctic; from the Yukon to Siberia. From this, he has published over 140 peer-reviewed scientific articles.

He is a Fellow of the American Geophysical Union, the 2007 Massey medallist of the Royal Canadian Geographic Society, holds the Sidney Chapman Chair at the University of Alaska, is an adjunct professor at the University of British Columbia and serves on various national and international editorial and advisory boards in his fields of expertise. He is still trying to learn to 'think like water'.
