Course Title: ONAE7002 Ship Structures II (course weight 1.113)

Course Description: ONAE 7002 Ship Structures II is an introduction to ship structural safety and rational design. Topics include local strength analysis, elastic, plastic and ultimate strength of plating, frames and grillages, buckling of plates/grillages and fatigue and fracture in ships. Laboratory exercises include structural analysis software and physical experiments.
