The gateway: come with us, from the coastal marine southwest coast fjords, from Badger to the terrestrial on the land to Miawpukek traditional territory, as we develop our marine and terrestrial protected areas in an indigenous-led way.

Conservation has always been fundamental to the way **Miawpukek First Nation (MFN)** chooses to manage its traditional territory. These lands have supported our people for thousands of years. They also support high ecological values, including intactness, caribou, complete watersheds, species-at-risk, important waterways, wetlands, and coastal boreal forests. MFN will develop a traditional land-use plan for our traditional territory, and this will include sites that will be identified as Indigenous Protected Areas.
