

Opportunities for graduate study at Memorial University's Department of Geography

Considering graduate study in geography? The Department of Geography at Memorial University of Newfoundland and Labrador in St. John's is offering **fully funded** studentships for **MA, MSc., and PhD** programs, starting in **Spring or Fall 2022**.

For Spring or Fall 2022 faculty in the Geography Department are recruiting Masters and PhD students in the following areas:
