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UPON ARRIVAL CHECKLIST

- Contact your family. Let them know that you are ok.
- Attend Orientation. You can find the orientation schedule on the walls around campus!
- Pay your tuition fees at Bursar's Office (AS279) before Sept. 9! Fees are ALWAYS due on the first day of classes. If courses are added on or after this date, you have 48 hours to pay and avoid late fees. **Late fees range from \$30 - \$75 depending on the amount owing.**
- Get your campus ID at the Library (LC 201)
- Learn about your health insurance and download your Guard.me healthcare card health by at guard.me/mun/myaccount. Use your MUN email to log in. **You will need your healthcare card if you need to use the emergency services or get any prescriptions.** For more information contact gcinternational@mun.ca.
- If applicable, register for the public Medical Care Plan (MCP) insurance that covers the costs of insured physician services and emergency services offered to Newfoundland and Labrador residents. Visit the International Office for more information.
- If you have not registered for courses, you can do it via MUN Self Service through my.mun.ca (if you need help, contact the Registrar's Office at gcregistrarsoffice@mun.ca)
- Connect with an academic advisor if you need any help or have questions about your courses. You can go to Registrar 's Office or email gacademicadvising@mun.ca to book an appointment.
- Make sure to complete your Academic Integrity 1000 (INTG 1000) and Sexual Violence Awareness and Prevention (SVM 0204) Course on Brightspace.
- If you are a Science or Visual Arts student, make sure to register and complete your lab safety course/WHMIS on Brightspace.

PERMANENT RESIDENCY APPOINTMENTS

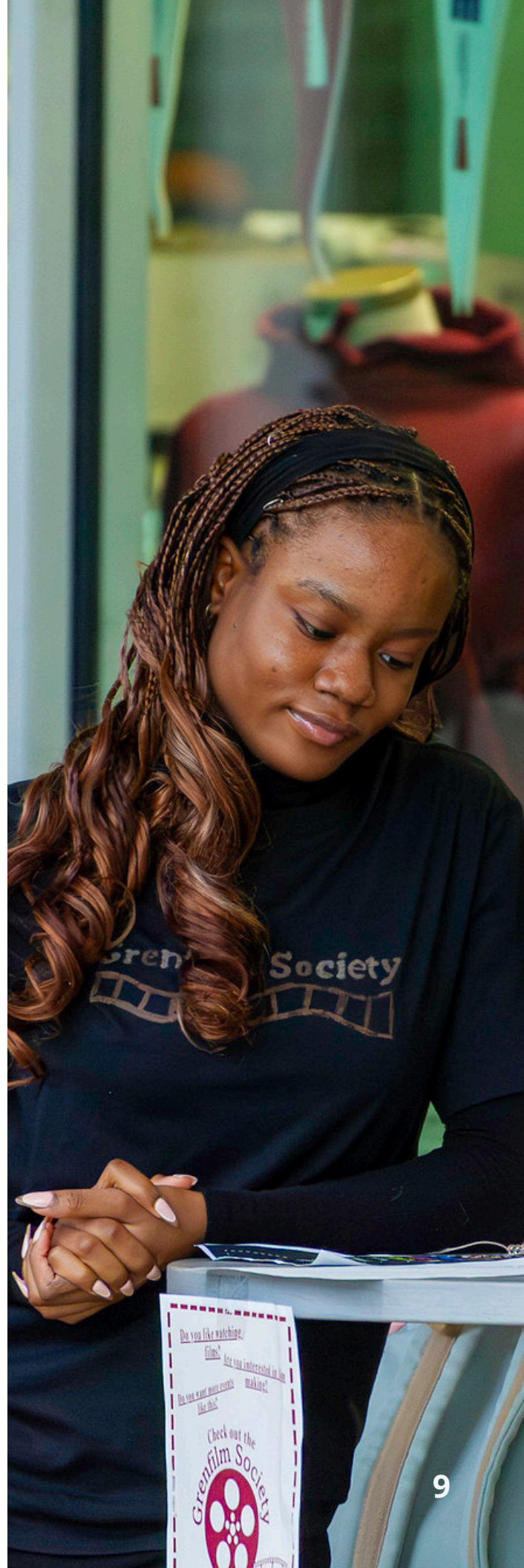

THE GRENFELL PEER SUPPORT PROGRAM

Are you a new international student who would like to get connected with current Grenfell students? The Grenfell Peer Support Program lets you do that by pairing currently enrolled international students at Grenfell with new incoming international students for the purpose of creating a social network for these students before they arrive to Canada.

Peer support students can help you answer questions about a wide variety of topics including:

- Where to go and who to talk to about campus and community resources

- Cultural norms in Canada and what to expect

HOSPITALITY CLUB

Grenfell Hospitality Club is another way that the Grenfell Campus community wishes to welcome you. As student members of the club, you will be matched with Grenfell Campus faculty and staff who will host you at their home for a meal (or elaborate snack) together.

CORNER BROOK TRANSIT M-CARD

If you want to move around Corner Brook, you can either get student passes at the bookstore, or you can visit the International Office to claim the new Transit M-Cards free of cost. With the card you can add funds online to your account at any time and purchase daily or semester bus passes. Visit the office and bring your student ID to claim one. Only one card per student will be provided.

CULTURE TO COMMUNITY

If you are interested in volunteering with children or education is part of your career goal, . Culture-to-Community (C2C) is the program for you.

The C2C program is aimed at promoting cultural awareness, sensitivity and respect for all individuals in western Newfoundland and Labrador through an equity, diversity, inclusion and anti-racism (EDIAR) lens. C2C links students in the kindergarten to grade 12 school system in Western Newfoundland with students at Grenfell Campus.

These programs seek to bring different perspectives into schools in Western Newfoundland and Labrador. All materials and transportation to the schools are provided by the International Office.

GROCERY SHUTTLE

The Grenfell Grocery shuttle is a free service that transits students to different shops around Corner Brook. The shuttle schedule changes every semester but usually runs on Sundays. Check your email, social media, and posters around campus to find out. The grocery shuttle always runs during orientation.



GOVERNMENT SERVICES CLINICS

There are multiple government-related services available to international students. For example, during the first week of classes in the fall and winter semesters, Service Canada offers in-person clinics to assist students in applying for a Social Insurance Number (SIN). Check the orientation schedule for specific dates.

During the winter semester, the CRA CVITP team leads virtual and in-person tax clinics to help students understand the Canadian tax system. If you are eligible to work, the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador's Labour Standards Division delivers virtual sessions focused on your rights in the workplace. All sessions are hosted by the International Office. Keep an eye on your email, Brightspace, and social media for updates on session dates and times.

NON-GOVERNMENT INFORMATION SESSIONS AND SOCIAL EVENTS

The International Office hosts a variety of information sessions and social events throughout the academic year to support students as they settle into campus life and build connections. These include orientation activities featuring campus tours, sessions with financial institutions to assist with setting up student bank accounts, and information on general student life. Other activities organized by the office include field trips, volunteering opportunities, mental wellness activities, and social gatherings. Students are encouraged to stay connected through email and social media for updates on upcoming sessions and events.





STUDENT COMMUNITY LEADERSHIP AWARDS

The International Office, along with Student Services, and the Internationalization Group created the Student Community Leadership awards that recognize international and domestic students who have contributed to a sense of community at Grenfell Campus and who have demonstrated innovation and leadership in their approach to community-building, particularly through volunteer initiatives.

Two awards are valued at \$1000 for a study permit holder student (to reflect their higher tuition) and \$500 for a domestic student (Canadian/Permanent Resident), who has demonstrated a strong sense of allyship with our international student population. Students should follow the criteria below:

- be a full-time student
- have completed a minimum of 9 credit hours in order to be eligible
- can be nominated by a student, faculty, staff, or a community member
- can be self-nominated
- nominations must include a letter that explains how the nominee has demonstrated innovation and leadership in the international community and three supporting signatures

Furthermore, the Community Member Award will be given to a member of the Corner Brook community who works and supports the welfare of our international students. The awards will be given during the Student Achievement awards.

The deadline to send in nominations is in February each year.

HEALTH INSURANCE

GUARD.ME

All international students are automatically enrolled in our mandatory foreign Health insurance [Guard.Me](#). It is important to have your healthcare card with you as you will need it in case of an emergency or to get any prescriptions. Otherwise, you will be expected to pay for any emergency medical services. Note that:

- You are only enrolled if you are a registered student and are enrolled in courses. If you are not registered in Spring, you will not be enrolled but can [purchase coverage](#) by emailing nclark@mun.ca.
- Coverage dates align with the semester. For example, coverage for Spring is May 1 to August 31.
- Your GuardMe policy number and healthcare card will be sent to your MUN email within the first 30 days of the semester.
- For information on coverage and making a claim, you can visit guard.me/mun/myaccount. Use your MUN email to log in.
- Your dependents are not automatically enroll.

If you cannot get your healthcare card or have questions, please email nclark@mun.ca.

COVERAGE

Guard.me offers some emergency and non-emergency services. Coverage information can be found in your guard.me account by downloading your policy.

MOBILE DOCTOR

Connect with Canadian doctors via Maple, a telemedicine company, as a part of your health benefits. Maple provides access to doctors, Canada wide, on your phone, tablet or computer anytime, anywhere.

Seeing a doctor on Maple is safe and reliable, and can help prevent the need to go to a walk-in clinic or Emergency Room.

Your doctor can give you a diagnosis, a prescription, and even a lab requisition. Register and create an account at www.guard.me/mobiledoctor.

GUARD.ME OPT OUT

You are eligible to opt out from the foreign health insurance plan if one of these statements applies to you:

- I am studying outside of Canada (including students in IEP-G/IEBP-G studying online from outside of Canada)
- I am sponsored by one of the following groups who provide me with insurance: Libyan Scholarship program through CBIE
- I am a refugee claimant and covered under the Federal Government
- I am a full-time student (excludes undergraduate students on a work term and IEP-G/IEBP-G) with valid MCP
- Graduate students are only eligible to opt out in their first semester or Fall semester unless could not meet opt out deadlines due to delay/ineligibility of MCP coverage dates
- If you are part time student, you are not eligible to opt out
- If you are an IEP-G/IEBP-G student studying from within Canada, you are not eligible to opt out

MEDICAL CARE PLAN

The **Medical Care Plan** (MCP) is the provincial health insurance free to residents of Newfoundland and Labrador, including your family and dependants. With MCP, you can see a doctor on Campus, find a family doctor, or go to a walk-in clinic.

Under MCP, you will be covered for:

- Doctor's visits
- Surgical, diagnostic and therapeutic procedures
- Pre- and post-operative care
- Maternal care
- Radiology services
- Certain in-hospital dental surgeries
- Other services

To apply you need to:

- Be a full-time student and have an enrollment letter issued within 30 days
- Have a study permit valid for at least one year
- Have a copy of your passport
- MCP application form (www.gov.nl.ca/hcs/mcp/).

You can bring or send all a copy of your documents to the international office. MCP applications are mailed Friday mornings.

DENTAL AND EYE CARE



Neither MCP nor GuardMe cover dental or eye care. In some emergency situations, dental care can be covered by both insurance providers. The undergraduate and graduate student unions provide alternative insurance that students can opt into. Contact your student union to learn more about this service. International students must be eligible to opt out of guard.me in order to enroll in the student union health insurance.

USEFUL INFORMATION

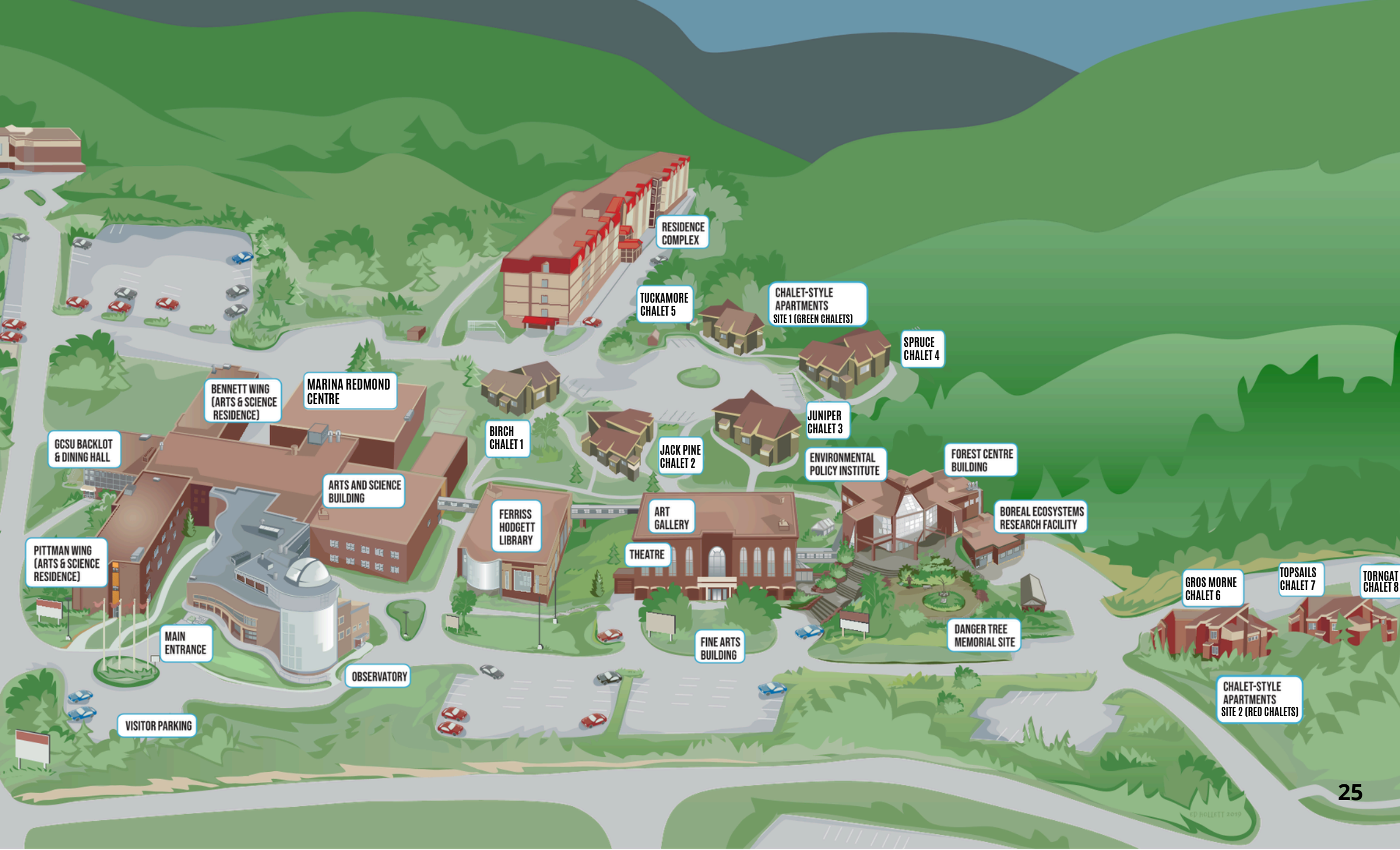
- Sales Tax is common in Canada. The price tag is not the final price. There is a 15% tax on the price tag.
- If you are from a tropical country be prepared to face extreme winter.
- You need to contact a pharmacy if you need to get prescriptions. Show your healthcare card (guard.me or GSC) before you pay as prescriptions may be covered.
- Use the available and free resources such as student discounts, university resources and rewards or bonuses.
- Undergraduate students: Maintain a minimum of three courses each semester to remain a full-time student.
- Ask an immigration advisor if you are eligible to work in Canada. If so, ask what documents you need!
- If you are considering buying a car as soon as you come to Canada, consider that there are many expenses associated with it like your monthly payments, insurance, winter and summer tires, registration etc.
- Introduce yourself to your professor and departments on campus. During the school year, your professors and the staff on-campus are your best friends. Introduce yourself and try to get to know them.
- If you wish to opt out of guard.me (your health insurance), and enroll in the student union health plan, visit guardme/mun.
- Keep a track of the university calendar as well as your course due dates. One missed assignment could cost you the whole course.
- Feeling lonely and nostalgic is normal. Grenfell Campus provides counseling through CPS and the student support program via Guard.Me.
- Always carry change. Public transit costs \$3.25 per ride. You can buy bus passes at the bookstore
