

MEET THE STEERING COMMITTEE

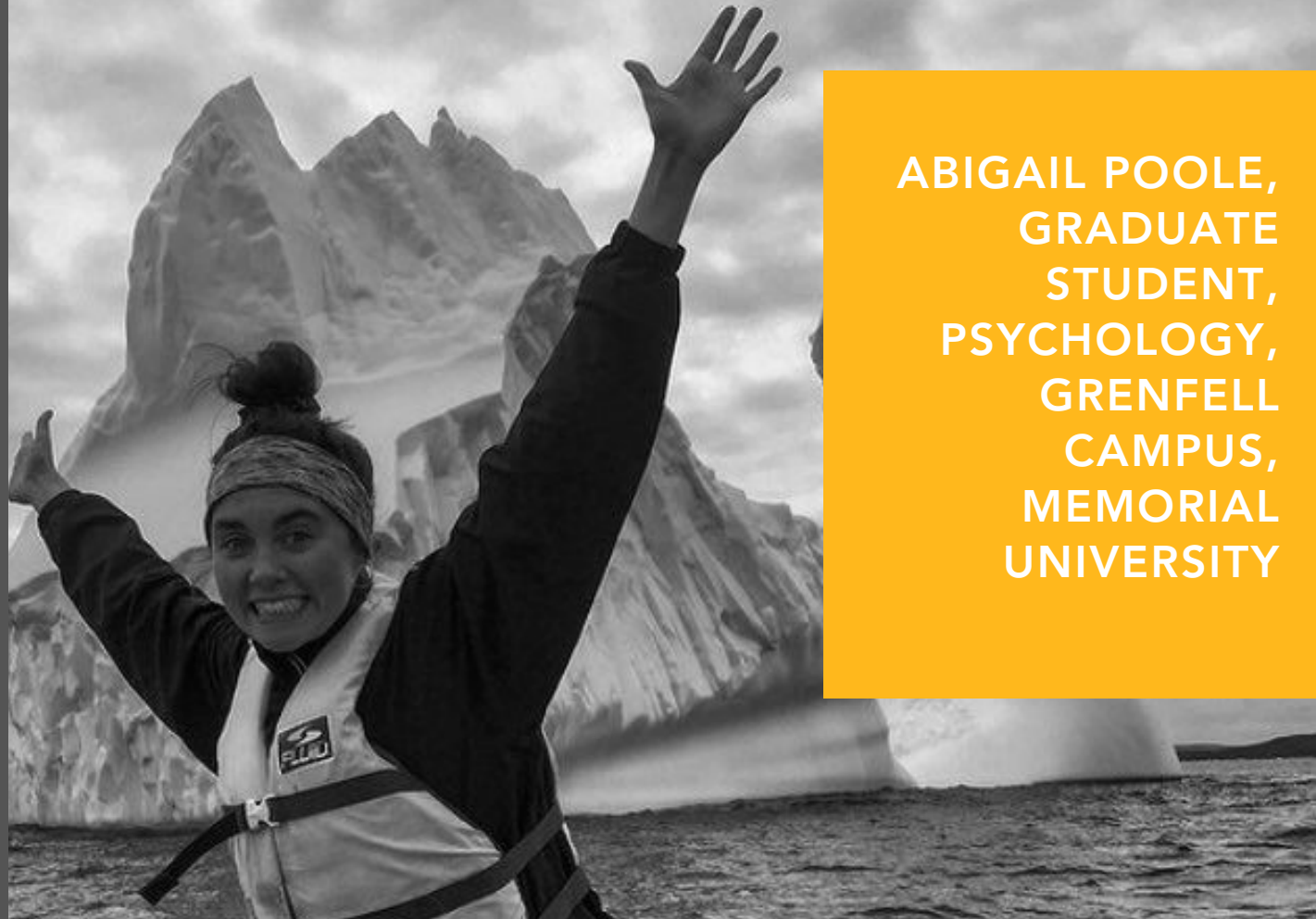
