

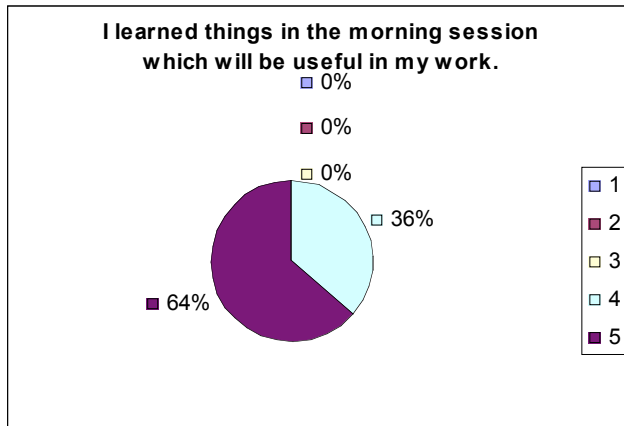
***Harris Centre Regional Workshop:

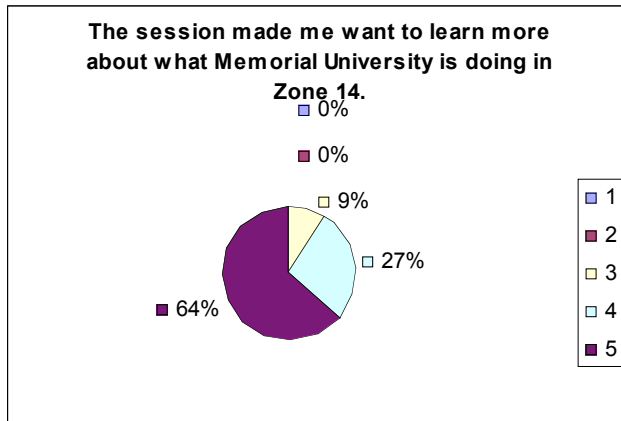
**THE MORNING SESSION**

- 100% of responses fell in the high end (agree) of the scale (4-5).

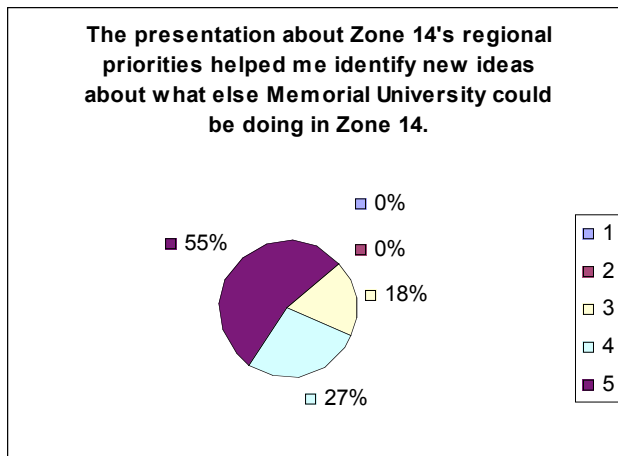
## QUESTION 2

- 91% of responses fell in the high end (agree) of the scale (4-5).

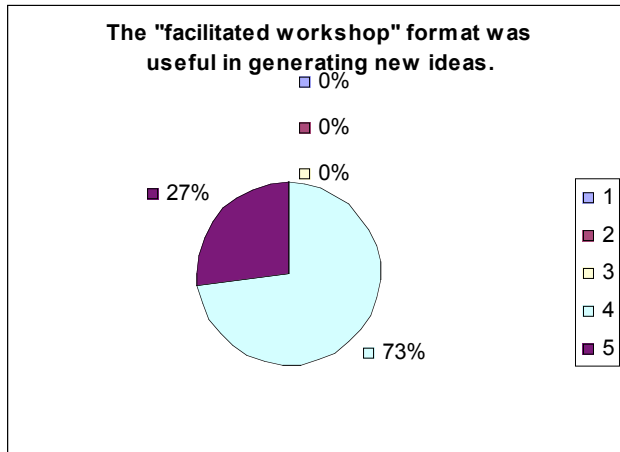
## THE AFTERNOON SESSION

- 82% of responses fell in the high end (agree) of the scale (4-5).

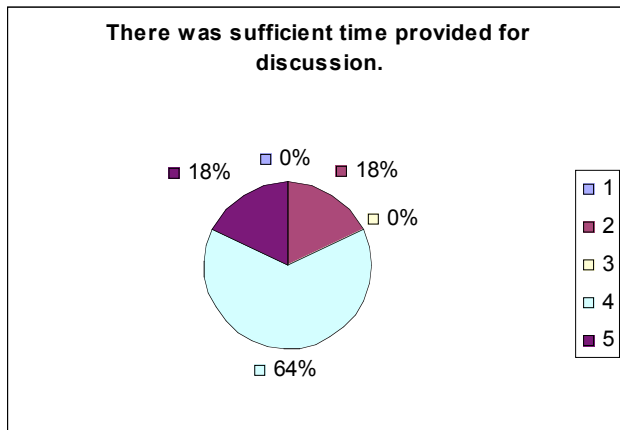
#### QUESTION 4

#### OVERALL

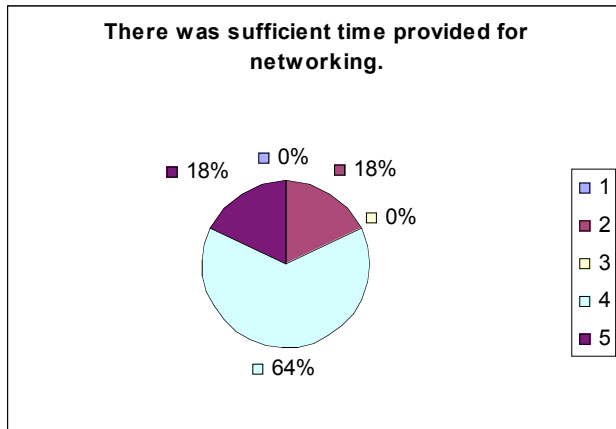
#### QUESTION 5

- 82% of responses fell in the high end (agree) of the scale (4-5).

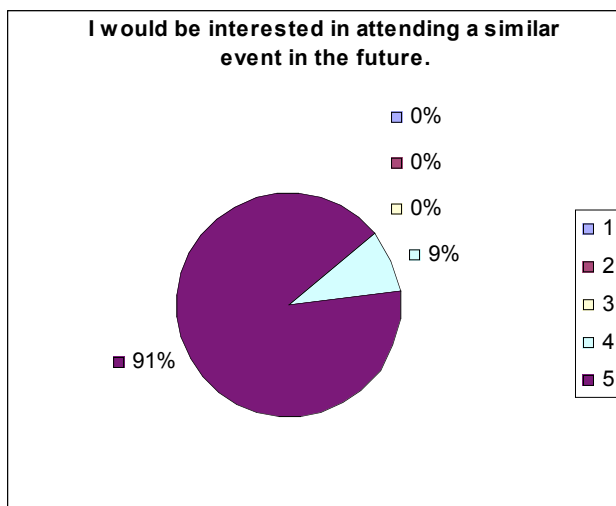
