


- Adversarial approach: the more you punish the less likely they will do it again;
- Restorative approach: the stronger the relationship the less likely we will act inappropriately towards each other (IIRP, 2000)

Restorative Justice ...

- A philosophy of social engagement nurturing:
 - Interconnectedness
 - Trust
 - Belonging
 - Love
- By engaging with one another so that the worth and interconnectedness of all human beings is honoured at all times.



A RESTORATIVE SCHOOL ENVIRONMENT:

Social control to social engagement

Focuses on:

- Relationships instead of rules & behaviour
- People instead of policies
- Honouring instead of measuring
- Well-being instead of success






