



## Community Check-In: Full

Asking the question - "How are we doing?" - and the conversation that follows are the first steps in building the kind of vibrant and thriving neighbourhood, community and region we want to live in. This simple assessment tool will help you discover untapped potential and find ways of working, creating solutions, and building hope together.<sup>1</sup>

## Instructions for using the tool:

How does your community or region tend to engage in public discussions, come to collective decisions and work together? Each of the statements in the tool on the following pages reflect a key quality, capacity or practice that contributes to a community's or region's civic health and resilience – its ability to come together and effectively address problems and tough challenges.<sup>2</sup>

Read each of these statements and, for each statement, place a checkmark in the response column that most closely reflects your observations and experiences. NOTE: This tool and the following discussions work best if you respond based on your personal perspective. Do <u>not</u> try to anticipate or assume "what most people will say" about each quality as you choose your response.

The tool is divided into nine short sections, each with 2-3 questions. At the end of each section, you can add additional comments to further explain or illustrate your responses.

When you are done, hand your responses to a member of the facilitation team. They will compile and share the collective responses back to the full group. The combined response will be used to inform the group's discussions about opportunities to enhance the region's capacity to work together effectively and actions you can take to create a thriving region. {NOTE: You are not required to put your name on your response sheet. However, if you would like us to return your individual responses to you at the end of the workshop, please write your name somewhere on the first page.}
