## CANADIAN ASSOCIATION OF GEOGRAPHERS AWARD



Dr. Carissa Brown of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences is this year's recipient of the Julian M. Szeicz Award for Early Career Achievement. The award's purpose is to foster the development of geographical studies of Canada and to provide recognition of recently established geographical practitioners. Here at Memorial, Dr. Brown currently leads the Northern EDGE Lab, where she collaborates with graduate students and other researchers to conduct research in Arctic, boreal and temperate ecosystems on topics related to biogeography, climate change and disturbance.
