## **Humanities and Social Sciences, Special Meeting of Faculty Council**

Wednesday, July 15, 2020

The Special meeting of Faculty Council in the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences was held on Wednesday, July 15, 2020, at 1:00 p.m. via WebEx. The focus of this meeting was HSS and anti-racism efforts. Approximately 50 people attended this meeting, which was a follow-up meeting to one on June 10 on the same topic.

## **Approval of the Agenda**

Moved and Seconded that the Agenda be approved (S. Curtis/P. Basabose). Carried.

# Approval of Minutes of the Anti-Racism in HS meeting held on June 10, 2020

Moved and Seconded to accept the minutes of the June 15, 2020 meeting (N. Catto/L. Ashworth). Carried.

Dean stated meeting objective: to come to a clearer sense of a vision for Faculty-wide change specifically focusing on teaching and research and related to anti-racism.

#### **Questions of Clarification and Context**

The first agenda item offered those at the meeting an opportunity to ask questions of clarification and context regarding the July 14 memorandum. Those at the meeting had no questions.

#### Discussion of Faculty-Wide Efforts in Relation to a) Teaching and b) Research

On the whole, discussion focused on several possible initiatives in the below themes: *Curriculum and programming* 

- Create a centralized faculty-wide list of all courses that address racism and colonialism.
- Departments might create new courses.
- Revisit the BA core requirements to ensure that sufficient numbers of courses focus on antiracism.
- Revisit the Syllabus Development Resource provided by the Dean's Office to include a statement of commitment that HSS is an environment that does not tolerate racism.

#### Training for Faculty and Administrative Staff in HSS

- Identify possible training for faculty and staff to support a better sense of the systemic issues of racism and possibilities for anti-racism.
- Identify areas for education for ASMs related to anti-Black racism, various theoretical perspectives, etc.

#### Miscellaneous

- Increase enrolments of Black and Indigenous students within HSS; recruitment and retention of a more diverse student body.
- Review of Police Studies program.
- Petition to take down statue outside of Confederation Building

# Next Steps, Timeline

- Dean's Office will bring one or two ways forward to September or October Faculty Council meeting for approval.
- Support for either new committee or sub-committee of the Planning and Research Committee to continue the discussion (with regular reports back to Faculty Council). Point was made that a new committee would allow for a more planned process of constituting the committee in relation to the committee's focus of anti-racism.
