

Wesley and Jeanne Drodge NL Research Partnership Award Application Form

The purpose of this award is to encourage residents of Newfoundland and Labrador to explore their heritage, develop a greater understanding of and a capacity to promote it, as well as promote the province's place in Canadian history. This will be awarded annually to a graduate student in the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences who is utilizing materials from local Newfoundland and Labrador archival agencies, museums and/or libraries to complete their program. Preference will be given to a resident of Newfoundland and Labrador who demonstrates the aspiration to pursue a career in the field of Newfoundland and Labrador heritage. The recipient must meet the minimum academic requirements for an award as defined by the University. This award will be granted by the Associate Vice-President (Academic) and Dean of the School of Graduate Studies on the recommendation of the Dean, Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences. For 2022, this award is \$1,086.
