The position will begin July 1, 2024 on St. John's Campus. We are seeking candidates that have a PhD in hand by the time of appointment, an active research agenda, and a strong record of teaching experience in the field of Black Feminisms in Canada, the US and/or Global Black Feminisms.

The successful candidate will contribute to the Gender Studies undergraduate and graduate programs in Gender Studies. We seek a candidate qualified to share the teaching of core courses in Gender Studies and to develop courses in Black Feminisms.

Preference will be given to applicants who are Black or a person of colour as per approval granted by the Human Rights Commission pursuant to Section 8 of the Human Rights Act.
