ACLS Foundation Geomatics Scholarship

Four scholarships of \$2,000.00 each are available annually. One scholarship is targeted to an Indigenous student that meets the eligibility requirements. Eligible applicants are students in good standing, registered full-time, and continuing studies in a geomatics program at a recognized University, Technical Institute or Community College in Canada. Canada Post Awards for Indigenous Students

The Canada Post Awards for Indigenous Students were created in 2004 to celebrate the hard work and determination of individuals of Indigenous heritage who've embraced a renewed pursuit of learning. You're eligible to apply for the Canada Post Awards for Indigenous Students if: you are a member of a First Nation, Métis, or Inuit community living in Canada,

you have been out of school for 1 year or more, you returned to school and have recently completed one year of studies (between January of last year and August of this year), you have never received this award in the past (previous award recipients are not eligible). The awards are granted annually to select applicants from across the country, and recipients are awarded \$2,000 in recognition of their efforts.

Congress of Aboriginals Peoples Employment Training Funding

The Congress of Aboriginal Peoples provides assistance and funding for training and skills development to Indigenous Peoples living off-reserve. Through the Indigenous Skills and Employment Training Program (ISETP), the program is designed to help Indigenous People prepare for, and find high-demand jobs that will help address Canada's labour market challenges. Funded through Employment and Social Development Canada, the Congress' employment programs and services provide Indigenous Peoples the opportunity to gain the skills required to find employment and fill job gaps in sectors experiencing skills and labour shortages. The ISET program is targeted to Indigenous People living in urban, rural and

remote areas throughout Canada. Those eligible to apply include Indigenous youth, women, single parents, mature workers, persons with disabilities and those experiencing career change or transition.

Valued at a portion of the income on the endowment, the award will be granted annually to an Indigenous undergraduate student in any year of study who has graduated from a high school in Labrador. Students can demonstrate their Indigenous heritage through provision of a membership card or demonstrate that they are claimed by their Indigenous community by providing a letter from a leader in their Indigenous community (for example, an elder or local

leader). Students must meet the minimum academic requirements for an award as defined by Memorial University of Newfoundland. In cases where there are equally deserving candidates, preference will be given to academic achievement.

Eva and Herschel Gora Bursey

This is a 4-year bursary valued at \$4,000 per year for an undergraduate student of Indigenous ancestry who is enrolled in either the Faculty of Engineering, the Faculty of Nursing, the School of Pharmacy, the Faculty of Science, or the School of Social Work. Students can demonstrate their Indigenous heritage through provision of a membership card or demonstrate that they are part of their Indigenous community by providing a letter from a community leader or Elder in their Indigenous community. Eligible students must meet the minimum academic requirements for a bursary as defined by the University. This bursary is renewable for an additional three years, four years in total, provided the successful candidate continues to maintain the academic requirements for a bursary.

In the case of graduate students, the scholarship will be awarded by the Dean of Graduate Studies upon the recommendation from the Dean, Faculty of Business Administration.

Hebron Diversity Award

Awards will be available to full-time or part-time students, enrolled at any Campus of Memorial University of Newfoundland, who have aboriginal status, a disability, or who represent a visible minority. Students with a disability should provide supporting documentation (from a medical doctor, psychologist, audiologist, rehabilitation counselor, or other professional who has specific training, expertise, and experience in the diagnosis of this condition). Students will claim aboriginal and visible minority status through self-identification. Of those eligible students, further preference will be given to students who are majoring in engineering, the geosciences, environmental science or chemistry. Normally, at least one award will be granted in each designated area and where possible, at least one award will be granted to a student in his/her first year of study. For students at the St. John's or Grenfell Campus the awards will be granted by the Senate Committee on Undergraduate Scholarships, Bursaries and Awards upon the recommendation of the appropriate Department Head.

If there are no suitable candidates in a given year, the Award may be given to a Canadian student who is a woman or gender minority (including two-spirit, transgender, and nonbinary persons) and Indigenous, in any year of undergraduate studies and who meets the minimum academic requirements for an award as defined by the University. The Award will be renewable for up to four additional

years provided the recipient maintains the minimum academic requirements for an award as defined by the University. A new student will be selected when the previous student completes their eligibility.
