

Study Permit Refusal Advice Intake Form



The Immigration Advising Team (IAT) with the Internationalization Office (IO) of Memorial University of Newfoundland can provide you with feedback on your study permit refusal which can assist you in a study permit re-application.

Prior to providing you with this feedback, the IAT will require all of the following in one email:

1. Completion of this intake form
2. Copies of all IRCC study permit refusal letters
3. Copy of GCMS notes (if you have them)
4. Copy of the study plan (or statement of purpose/letter of explanation) you submitted with your most recent study permit application
5. Copy of submitted application form (Application for a study permit made outside of Canada- IMM 1294)

It is important to note:

- Re-applying for a study permit is not the only option available to you when you have been refused a study permit. You may be eligible for reconsideration or you may choose to go through a judicial review. For more information on your options, you can [register](#) to view our video on [Initial Study Permits](#).
- The feedback you will receive as a result of this consultation is limited to the information you have provided and does not constitute a full review of your application.
- The feedback you will receive as a result of this consultation does not guarantee your re-application for a study permit will be successful.
