Recognition of prior learning, professional background, lived experience, and cultural knowledge are included in acceptance decisions. Please apply through the Memorial University School of Graduate Studies website (<https://www.mun.ca/sgs/>).

Application requirements include:

Master's and Ph.D. Programs

- **Curriculum Vitae (CV)**, outlining academic, professional, and personal experiences.
- **Most recent transcripts** (e.g. graduate, undergraduate).
- **2 letters of reference** (1 academic source; 1 professional or community source).
- **1-page summary of research interests**, outlining connections to the program and potential research focus, including commitment to working with Northern communities, governments, and/or organizations. Template provided on the program website.
- **1 sole- or first-authored writing sample** (e.g. academic, report, policy, or creative).

Graduate Diploma

- **Curriculum Vitae (CV)**, outlining academic, professional, and personal experiences.
- **Most recent transcripts**, if applicable (e.g. graduate, undergraduate).
- **2 letters of reference** (1 academic source; 1 professional or community source).
