The origins of the Krieger-Nelson Prize Lectureship

Abstract:

The Krieger-Nelson Prize Lectureship honours outstanding research by women members of the Canadian mathematical community. First awarded in 1995, it is named after Cecilia Krieger (1894-1974), the first woman to earn a Ph.D. in mathematics from a Canadian university, and Evelyn Nelson (1943-1987), a prolific researcher in universal algebra. In this talk, we explore the origins and early history of this prize, from the motivations behind its establishment, to the legacies and contributions of Krieger and Nelson themselves.
