Morning Reports

<u>Mondays</u>

- 1st Monday of block Intro to Rotation/Feedback Rounds
- Other Mondays either Independent Study Time, or Diagnostic Rounds
 - **Diagnostic Rounds**: Staff led. They will include blood smears, chest x-rays, PFTs, urinalysis, CT scans, dermatology.

<u>Tuesdays</u>

• Subspecialty Case Rounds: Residents on subspecialty selective will teach these rounds. Interesting Case presented, followed by teaching around the topic. If there are no residents available on the given selective, this will be converted to Independent Study Time.

<u>Wednesdays</u>

<u>Thursdays</u>

• **CTU Case Based Rounds:** These will continue to occur once per month for each CTU. The clinical clerk(s) on the assigned CTU will present a case seen by the CTU. The residents on the team will bring up some teaching points around the case (differential diagnosis, investigations, management, etc.). The entire CTU must participate. These sessions are designed to bring about discussion around the case (a slideshow is not necessary). The staff covering the assigned CTU will attend.

<u>Fridays</u>

• **EKG Rounds:** the residents on the "active" Cardiology team will present a series of EKGs for the audience to interpret. The residents and staff on the Cardiology team will provide teaching around the EKGs.

<u>Noon Rounds</u>

<u>Mondays</u>

• Infectious Disease Rounds: This schedule is made by ID staff, and residents completing an ID selective will usually be assigned once during their time on ID.

Tuesday/Wednesdays (a variety of rounds will be offered on these days)

• Evidence Based Medicine Rounds: Residents on subspecialty selective will teach these rounds. Topics will be assigned in advanced to ensure even

coverage of Royal College objectives (though residents can choose an alternative objective and let the Teaching Residents know within 48 hours of the teaching schedule being released). Residents present a case, followed by a review of pertinent evidence (including guidelines, new research, etc.). If there are no residents available on the scheduled selective, this will be converted to **Independent Study Time.**

- Fellow Rounds: Fellows from GIM, Nephrology or Medical Oncology will give Evidence Based Medicine rounds.
- Auscultation Rounds: These will occur ~ monthly, and will be led by a Cardiologist. Due to space/logistics, these will be offered first to R3s, then R2s (space permitting). As the Royal College exam gets closer, we will try to include other bedside physical exam rounds as well.
- **Patient Safety Rounds**: ~8 times per year. These rounds will (usually) be given by the senior resident on Emergency Consults. There will be a case presentation, followed by a discussion around patient safety.
- Med Path Rounds: These will occur 4 times each year. These rounds are collaborative a junior and senior Medicine resident will work with a Pathology resident to present an interesting case.
- **Cardiology Rounds:** This is Evidence Based Medicine Rounds, but featuring a Cardiology topic and presented by the residents on the "inactive" Cardiology team.
- Wellness Rounds: These will occur once a month and will be organized and delivered by Wellness Committee.
