Learning Contracts

Starting this month, there will meet again to go over what be a rollout of Learning Contracts!

These will be done at the beginning of each block, and will document a set of goals to be accomplished by the residents in their block

Learning contracts will be reviewed at the start of each block, in the same way as learning objectives currently are.

How it works:

Residents and staff meet on discuss:

- 1. Learning Goal Ex: Evaluate chronic liver disease on examination
- 2. Clinical Opportunity Ex: admission or follow up exam of a patient with cirrhosis on CTU

At the midpoint or end of the rotation, residents and staff was achieved, and how it was beneficial.

Ex: Was able to examine effectively for the stigmata of chronic liver disease in 3 patients admitted to the CTU, which improved confidence in technique.

The contract should be signed when you meet - at the start & midpoint of rotation!

- Residents have more ownership of the goals they set with staff
- Ensures that any specific EPAs or clinical goals are reasonable to obtain early in rotations, especially as CBD rolls out
