Faculty of Medicine curriculum is given priority up to June 1st, 2024. Bookings are then opened to outside users. A friendly reminder that the Standardized Patient (SP) Program has a high demand and requires time to arrange, recruit, and train our SPs.

Please list all requirements for your session on your booking request form. If your session requires the use of task trainers, SPs, high-fidelity manikins, etc., we will need to know to ensure all your needs are met. We cannot guarantee additional resources will be available, if requested at a later date.

Confirmation of sessions will be tentative until you submit your objectives, cases and supporting materials. This documentation is required eight weeks prior to the session (or dry run if applicable). Tentative confirmations will be sent to Faculty of Medicine users the first week of June. Users from outside the Faculty of Medicine users will receive confirmations shortly thereafter.
