The Discipline of Family Medicine is recruiting for clinical positions at the level of Clinical Assistant Professor or above, based on experience. These positions are eligible for promotion in accordance with Faculty of Medicine guidelines related to strong performance in education, leadership, research, and clinical excellence. These positions are anticipated to commence in July 2024, subject to budgetary approval.

These are salaried clinical positions; part-time and full-time applicants will be considered. Clinical responsibilities will include a diversified Family Medicine practice linked to one of the three academic teaching sites in St. John's. The successful candidate(s) will be expected to practice broad scope Family Medicine and teach medical learners in the clinic setting.

Candidates must be certificants of the College of Family Physicians of Canada and eligible for full licensure by the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Newfoundland and Labrador. A salaried payment package allows for support to include medical education as part of the practice.
