A full-time faculty position in Palliative Care is available in St. John's. This position provides an academic salary to enable the candidate to balance the expected scholarly activity in education, leadership, and research with their existing personal clinical commitments in Palliative Care. This position is eligible for promotion and tenure in accordance with Faculty of Medicine guidelines related to strong performance in education, leadership, research, and clinical excellence. The position is anticipated to commence April 1, 2026, subject to approval.

Academic responsibilities include undergraduate and residency education in Palliative Care within the Discipline of Family Medicine and the Faculty of Medicine. Priorities for this position include resident support, resident assessment, curriculum development and faculty development for the Care of the Elderly Enhanced Skills Program and Geriatric Medicine Program.

Candidates must be certificants of the College of Family Physicians of Canada and must hold a CFPC certificate of added competence in Palliative Care or equivalent certification. Candidates must be eligible for full licensure by the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Newfoundland and Labrador. Candidates must currently be doing clinical work in the area of Palliative Care and must have or be willing to earn an advanced degree or certificate in either research or education.
