During Phase 4 Core Experiences course,         formative assessments include clinic cards as well as         a midpoint meeting with the Clerkship Discipline         Coordinator (CDC) and all summative assessments         must be submitted within 4 weeks by preceptors to         allow the CDC time to complete the assessment.</li> <li>A reminder the Accreditation Visit is April 4-6, 2022         with a follow-up visit on May 11, 2022. Update on UPEI	Dr. Vardy provided an update on the recent visit to UPEI by Dr. Margaret Steele, Dr. Cathy Vardy and Mr. Paul Tucker. She noted the visit was very productive with a variety of activities attended including in-person meetings with a number of physicians, a Medical Society Board meeting where there was a presentation about the new medical school, and the Strategic Planning Day which focused on medical education. Also met with the Minister of Health and the Deputy Ministers who were very supportive of the new medical school as well as	

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	with the Registrar and Deputy Registrar of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of PEI and a meeting with Chief Darlene Bernard from Lennox Island Mi'Kmaq First Nation.	
	Dr. Vardy noted the visit included touring different facilities and determined what facilities can be shared. She highlighted a couple of specific tours including the Veterinary College and Faculty of Engineering. Also toured number of hospitals and looked at what is needed for clinical rotations for undergraduate and postgraduate. Toured two hospitals and had an opportunity to see where the site for the new medical school will be.	
	Working on a number of initiatives. As this is a joint program and unique to Canada, are looking at a new governance structure. The steering committee is chaired by Dr. Margaret Steele and Dr. Greg Keefe, and the subcommittees report into the steering committee. Dr. Vardy noted, in particular, the facilities subcommittee, and with regards to facilities what needs to be added to hospitals to have a successful medical education program. Upcoming meetings scheduled for new committees include the faculty development committee and the community engagement. Dr. Vardy gave a big shout out to the faculty and staff who have contributed to the committees.	
	Mr. Tucker also noted they met with UPEI communications staff, who want to develop a website to be able to provide updates on where the committees are with their work. Dr. Vardy noted there is strong IT presence on all the committees.  Dr. Vardy thanked everyone for all their help.

Notice of Motion: Human Neuroscience Research Centre Updated Proposal	Dr. McKeen introduced the Notice of Motion for the Human Neuroscience Research Centre Proposal and invited Dr. Ploughman to speak to the proposal.  Dr. Ploughman indicated the proposal was updated based on the extensive feedback from the August 2021 meeting. She explained the proposal is an opportunity for human neuroscience researchers from across the university to work together, for example, in the Schools of Music, and Human Kinetic and Recreation, Departments of Psychology and Computer Science, Faculty of Engineering and Applied Science, and Marine Institute and to strive for collaborative projects and larger grants. She noted the benefit to the Faculty of Medicine is that clinical faculty could be associate members and strengthen their research profile.  Dr. Tabrizchi indicated the proposal has now been put forward as a Notice of Motion with the next steps being to review the material and return to the April 19, 2022 meeting to discuss and vote on the proposal.
