Welcome and Introduction	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Dr. Tabrizchi welcomed everyone to the meeting both in person and virtually.- Welcomed invited guests Dr. Patrick Parfrey and Lynn Taylor.	
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Review of Agenda• Conflict of Interest	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Dr. Tabrizchi added to the agenda under “Other Business” an update on the flood in the Health Sciences (HS) Library.- Dr. Ann Dorward moved approval of the agenda; seconded by Dr. Norah Duggan.- COI - none noted; agenda approved.	
Review and approval of prior minutes of April 18, 2023	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Dr. Tabrizchi noted the minutes will be filed as notes for the April 18, 2023 meeting as quorum for the meeting was not achieved.- There was a friendly amendment to the notes to update the list of regrets from the April 18, 2023 meeting.	

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Presentation – Learning Health and Social Systems	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Dr. Patrick Parfrey provided a presentation entitled <i>“Development of a Learning Health & Social System using Cardiac Care as a Model”</i>. The presentation was well received. - Discussion surrounded: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Data and the available resources and processes to properly analyze it. - It was indicated that the Health Accord is a very good guide to develop a good learning health care system. However, it was noted there was no inclusion of social components, or the determinants around cardiac care’s data. Has there been thought given to places or organizations to seek the data to kind of wrap around that cardiac care. Dr. Parfrey noted that while the data is not available, they are trying to create a framework based on social determinants and are looking at the federal framework which includes metrics. - Interaction between the university and the health authority is modest, and this should be a priority. Should do more for an integration, Dr. Parfrey indicated agreement. - Graduate training opportunities is one avenue to create connections, and to encourage learners to pursue career opportunities and pathways that support the learning environment. Dr. Parfrey noted that he felt this is the responsibility of the medical school, the learning system and health and community services. - A place for clinical trials in the learning health system should be explored in more detail. The work of Dr. Andrew Hunt, Assistant Dean, Distributed Medical Education and his team as well as other faculty members and leaders is greatly appreciated.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Congratulations to the Medical Graduate Student Society (MGSS) for winning the Volunteer Group of the Year from Memorial's Student Volunteer Bureau. - The University was successful in their application for Canada First Research Excellence Fund (CFREF) in partnership with Inuit Circumpolar Council of Canada, "Clean Arctic Shipping Initiative" 2023-2029. Congratulations to Dr. Desai Shan from Division of Community Health and Humanities who was among the cohort of applicants from Memorial University for this envelope of funding. - Strategic Planning retreat planned for May 25, 2023 from 9 a.m. – 1 p.m. It will be hybrid session, and you can register via Office of Professional and Educational Development. - We are requesting participation in the third iteration of the Mistreatment Survey. UPEI Update	<p>Dr. Vardy provided an update –</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The strike at UPEI is now over and committees are up and running and back on track. - Dr. Vardy is stepping in, on behalf of Dr. Steele, for the inaugural UPEI Faculty of Medicine Dean’s search. Candidate presentations are scheduled for Dr. Preston Smith (Dean, College of Medicine, University of Saskatchewan) on Friday, May 12, 2023 and Dr. Kent Stobart (Professor, Department of Pediatrics, and Vice-Dean, Education, College of Medicine, University of Saskatchewan) on May 23, 2023. - In the process of finalizing an offer for the Associate Dean, UPEI. - Physician capacity – UPEI in collaboration with Health PEI hired a consulting company, Spindle to review physician and facilities capacity. - Interviews are happening regarding HR capacity issue. Have given list of people who would be important to interview. - Work continues on hiring – manager of lab medicine; policy analyst, communications and manager of faculty affairs. Both Tracey Pittman and Patricia Cousins are members of the search committees. - Construction on the building has started and things are going well. 	

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Senate Update	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Dr. Kendall presented the report as was submitted with the meeting materials. He did highlight that he does not normally include materials from Senate but felt these Reports from the Committee on Ceremonial Degrees and the Senate Review Report were of interest. - Dr. Kendall noted the regular agenda of Senate and the Report from the Teaching and Learning Committee on categories of experiential learning and its implication. He questioned whether this definition could apply to the medical education. Will MUN, in the future, recognize courses or even programs with this component. - Report on Senate Governance Reform - in order to promoted engagement, Senate needs to be more democratic. There is the hope there will be an elected speaker and other elected officials; strong efforts to increase representation on Senate.
