Introduction and	The Dean thanked everyone for joining the meeting,	
Welcome	both in-person and online. She introduced University	
	President, Dr. Vianne Timmons, and Provost and Vice-	
	President (Academic), Dr. Florentine Strzelczyk.	
Greetings from the	Dr. Timmons thanked everyone for attending and	
President and the	providing the contribution from Medicine to the	
Provost	University Strategic Plan (STRAT). She noted that just a	
	few tweaks are needed to the action plan to align with	
	the overall University plan. She reviewed the priorities	
	for the University including student recruitment and	
	retention with the new tuition framework, respectful	
	workplace, research (which is the most in Atlantic	
	Canada), and asked for more stories reflecting the	
	reputation of the University. She noted modifications to	
	the University Act were planned for next spring.	

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	Dr. Timmons also thanked faculty and staff for their outstanding work during COVID-19, and Dr. Steele on her continuing to represent the Faculty and University.	
	Dr. Florentine Strzelczyk spoke about the discontinuation of the hiring freeze. She noted that she was happy to engage, and was aware of the complexity of the budget with the Faculty of Medicine. She noted there were opportunities for the Faculty to participate in revenue generating programs, possibility in health sciences.	
	Dr. Timmons concluded by congratulating the Faculty of Medicine on the UPEI Proposal, and thanked the Dean for her guidance. Dr. Timmons then responded to questions from attendees and asked what she could provide for the Faculty of Medicine.	
	The Dean repeated the commitment of the President and Provost to the Faculty of Medicine, as the University enters a new era, and thanked them both for their responsiveness. She noted that Dr. Strzelczyk would be the keynote speaker for Destination Excellence in December.

Dean's Updates	<ul> <li>Update on UPEI Proposal: Following the recent meeting with UPEI, there was a big announcement with their University President and their Premier. The Dean noted that next steps would include setting up working groups, which would be led by Dr. Cathy Vardy.</li> </ul>	

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	<ul> <li>She reminded all of their Climate Change and Paramedicine programs, and asked for those with interest in these initiatives to come forward.</li> <li>The timeline for the first enrollment would be Fall 2023, following the construction of their building.</li> <li>The program would also follow Accreditation requirements, as a unique joint degree.</li> <li>Fall Convocation in St. John's will take place in person on October 22 with 38 graduates from the medical program to cross the stage. There would be a reception at lunchtime in the atrium, for those who would like to come by and offer congratulations.</li> <li>We continue to operate under a budget deficit. The operating budget deficit was reduced by half, to 2.5 million. There is a comprehensive plan to bring in revenue, along with additional cuts, but the budget is approved by the Board. This has allowed us to start recruitment for new faculty, for the first time in three years.</li> <li>Health Accord Updates – There are upcoming meetings, as well as Town Halls, with a report to be released in the New Year. If the Faculty would like, Sister Elizabeth Davis and Dr. Pat Parfrey could be invited to come back to a future Faculty Council meeting.</li> </ul>

Committee members will be asked to participate in implicit bias training modules. As well, the committees will be more engaged with the stakeholders instead of just the candidate meeting with the stakeholders.</li> </ul>
