

Orlo L.M. Jones Scholarship in Medicine Application Form



Background Information

This scholarship was established by a bequest from Orlo L.M. Jones (1929-2015) of Prince Edward Island (PEI). Orlo trained in Medical Laboratory Technology in PEI and furthered her studies at the Douglass College of Rutgers University with a Bachelor of Science degree. She worked and taught in the field of laboratory technology in Canada and the United States. In 1964, she returned to PEI and taught in Summerside schools. Orlo was also well-known for her expertise in the field of genealogy, particularly Loyalist history.

One or more scholarships will be awarded annually to students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine degree program at Memorial University of Newfoundland. Students must have graduated from a high school in a rural area of Atlantic Canada and meet the minimum academic requirements for a scholarship as defined by the University. Students will have indicated an interest in practicing medicine in rural areas of Atlantic Canada. Preference will be given to students who have demonstrated financial need.

Requirements

Applicants must:

1. Be a student in the Undergraduate Medical Education Program.
2. Meet scholarship standing as defined by the university.
3. Have graduated high school from a rural area in Atlantic Canada.
4. Optional: Submit a [bursary application form](#) to state your financial need. Please note, preference will be given to students who have demonstrated financial need.
5. Complete this application form.
