Dr. Detlef Beiger Neuroscience Award

This graduate student award was established by a generous donation to honor Dr. Detlef Beiger who had a long and distinguished career as a researcher making a significant contribution to the development of neuroscience and pharmacology research at Memorial University. His research interests and contributions have spanned the breadth of neuroscience and pharmacology, from neuroanatomy to understanding the neuronal networks and neurotransmitter interactions involved in the control of swallowing. His intellectual rigour and passion for excellence have been an inspiration to graduate students and colleagues in the Faculty of Medicine for over 40 years.

Eligibility:

Awarded annually to a **neuroscience graduate student** based on **academic performance, public presentation of research, and community engagement**.

Application Process:
