1. Business Arising	Curriculum change There is a proposal to add an extra sessions for Indigenous Health. It will build on indigenous health from a Newfoundland perspective. It builds on Phase 1 and fits well in Phase 2. The history in Newfoundland is unique. It ties into strategic planning. Indigenous Newfoundlanders hat to	



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	fight hard for recognition and some are still fighting. It would be a one hour online prerecorded sessions with no assessment.  Motion to approve There are no objectives All in favour to approve.  IPE on February 26 needs to be moved. There are other schools involved but the rest of campus are on winter break. Adam Reid proposed to move IPE to the afternoon of February 19. This is the only date to run IPE. Clinical skills and the labs are going to have to use some protected time. 2. Assessment	Community Engagement changes. Assessment will be a two week virtual activity. Students will engage and organize with communities for a virtual visit vs. on-site. There will be groups of 5 or 6 with an advisor. They will identify an organizer re: housing, social worker, and other health determinants. They will develop a PowerPoint presentation and share online with the class.
