3.0. Business Arising

- 3.1. Undergraduate Content Lead Recruitment
 - Surgery is the major outstanding area. There has been discussion with Pathology.

- 4.1. Integrated Learning Sessions Report
 - Susan was absent. The date for the formative peer assessment reflective
 exercise is extended. Phase 1 ILS is being reviewed. ILS in Phase 1 is harder to
 organize with a lack of disease oriented cases and the lack of a broader medical
 knowledge.

4.2. Assessment Working Group – Report

• Most topics are covered on the exams. There was an action item from the last Phase 3 meeting to add stats to the questions and providing the information to faculty. It is a workload issue to provide stats to everyone. Keep the status quo. We will provide the stats if asked by faculty. It is time consuming to review challenge cards and to match them with questions. About 1% of challenge cards are valid. Most credits are a result of question stats. Challenge cards are reviewed by the assessment working group. These issues are being discussed at SAS.

4.3. Research Curriculum/Independent Projects Working Group - Report

- The HREB has contacted UGME with concerns regarding the quality of student research ethics applications
 - A meeting has been arranged with HREB, UGME, the Phase leads and Phase Research Curriculum Leads
- A significant number of students are still awaiting ethics approval or submission for their projects. For next iteration, a formal office tracking system needs to be developed to see where the students are with their project to help keep them on schedule
 - Action: Joanne, Laura and Katrin will meet to review the number of students having difficulty and develop an action plan to help them move forward
- A discussion around the work flow of the research curriculum in Phase 2 and 3 occurred. Need to liaise with Phase 2 to streamline the student work between Phase 2 and 3. Can the ethics application should be completed by end of Phase 2?
- Some challenges in mentoring were discussed. In future, consideration of mentors research experience may need to be more closely considered.
 Consideration of identifying faculty members with significant experience (eg former ethics committee members) to act as central resources for students and less experienced faculty mentors
