SITE INFORMATION

St. John's Site:

The Obstetrics & Gynecology rotation consists of a total of six (6) core weeks divided into **5 weeks on Teams and 1 week in Labour & Delivery (Case Room)**

Each clerk is involved in the assessment and treatment of patients in the Women's Health clinics, Case Room and ORs; they will also participate in in-patient morning rounds. Clerks are on call on average **one night in four**.

Each clerk will participate in obstetrics, gynecology and subspecialty clinics. They will learn how to assess and manage patients suffering from a broad range of obstetric and gynecology disorders by means of practical hands-on-experience, discussion with health-care professionals (faculty and residents), observation, and "bedside" teaching, didactic lectures and independent reading.

Grand Falls-Windsor Site:

It is mandatory that one clerk, per each six-week rotation in Obstetrics & Gynecology, complete their core rotation at the GFW site. The design of this rotation is different than at the St. John's site; however similar training experiences are provided.

Clarenville Site:

There is an option to complete the six-week Obstetrics & Gynecology rotation at the Clarenville site. The design of this rotation is different than at the St. John's and GFW sites; however, similar training experiences are provided. Learners who opt to complete their six-week rotation at the Clarenville site, will attend their 6th (final) week at the St. John's site, for a week in Labour & Delivery (Case Room).

New Brunswick Site:

Another option is to do the core Obstetrics & Gynecology rotation in Saint John, New Brunswick, subject to availability. The design of the rotation is also slightly different than at the HSC/Janeway, but similar training experiences are provided.

Choice Sheet:

The Discipline of Obstetrics & Gynecology has a choice sheet which is made available following the lottery for the St. John's, Grand Falls-Windsor and Clarenville sites.

The option to attend the Saint John, NB site is organized by the UGME office; any requests to attend the Saint John site, should be directed to them.

ACADEMIC SESSIONS

Clerk Teaching:

Obstetrics & Gynecology clerk teaching takes place on Mondays (8-9 a.m.); Wednesdays (8 a.m. – 1 p.m.) and Fridays (8-9 a.m.). Attendance for all core clerks is mandatory (unless there are extenuating circumstances) and teaching sessions take priority over all other activities. Teaching sessions are made available to clerks, outside of St. John's and out-of-Province, via WebEx. In addition, clinical clerks are expected to participate other discipline-specific, learning sessions.

Grand Rounds:

Obstetrics & Gynecology Grand Rounds take place **every** Tuesday morning (8-9 a.m.) and clerks should attend these presentations. Grand Rounds are also available via WebEx so clerks completing their core rotations at other sites, or out-of-Province can attend. Case Rounds end in June for the summer and restart again in September.

Case Rounds:

Obstetrics & Gynecology Case Rounds take place **every** Thursday morning (8-9 a.m.) and clerks should attend these presentations. As with Grand Rounds, Case Rounds are also available via WebEx so clerks completing their core rotations at other sites, or out-of-Province, can attend. Case Rounds are presented throughout the year, including the summer months.

EVALUATION

Midpoint:

Evaluation at the mid-term point is based on a Formative ITAR.

Midpoint Formative Feedback Meeting:

At the midpoint of your rotation, clinical clerks will have an assigned meeting time with the clerkship coordinator/delegate. At this meeting, prescribed clinical clerkship core rotation experiences will be reviewed, as well as daily and weekly assessment (clinic) cards.

Obstetrics & Gynecology Review:

During the six-week Obs Gyne rotation, there will be a formative assessment in form of a short answer and multiple-choice exam (this is not an official part of the evaluation process, but rather for study/practice purposes and will be based on the topics for Obs Gyne clerk teaching). This exam will be administered as a take-home exam, scheduled towards the end of the rotation.

ROTATION ASSESSMENT METHOD

The successful completion of clerkship is measured, periodically, over the full clerkship year and takes into account all EPAs assessed at that point. The assessment method includes feedback from Weekly/Daily clinic cards (EPAs) in the form of a Formative and Summative ITAR and a Final ITAR. Your six-week rotation in Obstetrics & Gynecology will also include the following:

Midpoint Evaluation (halfway point of rotation) Core Rotation Experiences (Mandatory/Required)

Mini CEX (Witnessed H&P by an attending physician, faculty member, this is a mandatory component of our core rotation with Obstetrics & Gynecology)
